



## Public Hand Washing Station

Public hand washing stations provide residents with a source of potable water to wash their hands in spaces where people gather and in areas where there are common points of contact. Entrances to green spaces, near benches, picnic tables, bike parking, public transit and playgrounds are just a few of the locations that would benefit from this solution promoting hygienic practices. We have seen the way the public has adapted quickly to carrying hand sanitizer and believe a request to bring hand soap would be similar in nature.

### DID YOU KNOW?

According to the Centre for Disease Control (CDC), washing hands with soap and water is vastly more effective at eliminating sources of infection than using hand sanitizer.\* Alcohol-based hand sanitizers can quickly reduce the number of microbes on hands in some situations, but they are less effective on hands that tend to be more soiled in community settings. Proper hand washing is simply a better solution.

  - ◆ Simple installation with quick connect water supply, slip fit drain lines and discrete access hatches for easy servicing
  - ◆ Polyethylene water feed lines are FDA compliant and conform to ASTM
  - ◆ Heavy duty 1.5" PVC drain lines conform to ASTM
  - ◆ Housing is coated with an attractive and durable electrostatically applied polyester powder finish
